

Long before writing was invented, story-telling was both a form of entertainment and a way in which myths were handed down. The Sumerian epic of Gilgamesh, incised on clay tablets centuries before the Bible, contains such things as the flood and man's quest for immortality. Story-tellers in many cultures illustrate their narrative with images. In this performance the story is told with a background of light and shadow, populated with the figures from the tale. Music also often supports or accompanies story-telling and here it provides a third element creating a blend of word, image, and music.

The show, which will last about 45 minutes, will be presented by a live narrator and musician. Characters and moments of the

story will appear and merge as shadows on a screen and draw the audience into the world of Gilgamesh.

Dr. Martin Worthington will give an expert introduction detailing background information on Gilgamesh, one of the world's oldest known stories.

The two earliest writing systems known are Egyptian Hieroglyphs and Mesopotamian Cuneiform. Both originated as pictures (though Cuneiform signs quickly became very stylised, and unrecognisable). By which principles, then, were pictures used to represent words?


This talk will look at the Mesopotamian side, drawing on the speaker's current research. We will meet some very intuitive examples that still make sense to us today, like writing the verb 'to mix' with a picture of a cake, as well as more problematic cases which require the toolkit of philological tricks.

Martin Worthington is Al-Maktoum Associate Professor in Middle Eastern Studies at Trinity College Dublin. He specialises in Ancient Near Eastern languages and literatures, and is currently battling with a book on the logic of the Cuneiform script.

HOTEL LUX: An Irishwoman in Moscow

In this talk, historian Maurice Casey will share the story of the witty translator who lived in room number five of the Lux during four tumultuous years in the nineteen twenties: May O'Callaghan, a forgotten radical journalist who was raised in the small Wexford village of Ballinesker.

Why did an Irishwoman move to 1920s Russia? What were her experiences of revolution and romance in the revolutionary capital? How did a woman who once partied with Soviet celebrities end up dying in obscurity in a North London nursing home?

To answer these questions and more, Maurice will draw from histories told for the first time in his new book Hotel Lux. The book traces the life of May O'Callaghan and her friends – a set of revolutionaries who came to the Hotel Lux from Ireland, Germany, America, Ukraine, Britain and beyond.

Dr. Maurice J. Casey, originally from Cahir, is a historian based at Queen's University Belfast. He received his PhD in History from the University of Oxford in 2020. He also studied at Trinity College Dublin, Cambridge University and Stanford University. His first book Hotel Lux: An Intimate History of Communism's Forgotten Radicals was published this August by Footnote Press.

I danced here on other people's dreams: How race and class shaped my critical, journalistic eye.

Gary Younge is an award-winning author, broadcaster and a professor of sociology at the University of Manchester in England. Formerly a columnist at The Guardian he is an editorial board member of the Nation magazine, the Alfred Knobler Fellow for Type Media and winner of the 2023 Orwell Prize for Journalism. He has written six books: Dispatches From the Diaspora, From Nelson Mandela to Black Lives Matter; Another Day in the Death of America, A Chronicle of Ten Short Lives; The Speech, The Story Behind Martin Luther King's Dream; Who Are We?, And Should it Matter in the 21st century; Stranger in a Strange Land, Travels in the Disunited States and No Place Like Home, A Black Briton's Journey Through the Deep South. He has also written for The New York Review of Books. Granta, GQ, The Financial Times and The New Statesman and made

several radio and television documentaries on subjects ranging from gay marriage to Brexit.

Born in Hertfordshire to Barbadian parents, he grew up in Stevenage until he was 17 when he went to Kassala, Sudan with Project Trust to teach English in a United Nations Eritrean refugee school. On his return he attended Heriot Watt University in Edinburgh where he studied French and Russian (Translating and Interpreting).

After several years of reporting from all over Europe, Africa, the US and the Caribbean, Gary was appointed The Guardian's US correspondent in 2003, writing first from New York and then Chicago. In 2015 he returned to London where he became The Guardian's editor-at-large.

Lisa Hannigan is a versatile Irish folk singer/songwriter, multi-instrumentalist and voice actor, whose solo musical career has spanned 17 years. Hannigan released her debut album, "Sea Sew" in 2008, which earned her nominations for a Choice award in Ireland and a Mercury Music Prize in the UK. Since then, Lisa has released "Passenger" (2011), centred around the pain of leaving and the sense of apartness consequent to a life spent in constant motion, and "At Swim" (2016), a bewitching album where she handles darkness with empathy and directness that can only come with experience. Both albums saw huge critical acclaim in Ireland and the United States. 2019 saw the release of a live album with the contemporary classical orchestra, s t a r g a z e.

The collaboration, "Live in Dublin" – which sees Hannigan's sparse, ethereal folk transformed into something cinematic and transfixing – has been taken to select festivals across Europe, and most recently graced the stages of London's Barbican and Dublin's National Concert Hall.

CORNELIUS BROWNE,

A Garden a Stone's Throw from the Sea – curated by Catherine Marshall

Painters and place are closely connected in Irish art and literature and Cornelius Browne is far from being an exception to this tradition. He is revered among a select group of art lovers for his inspired landscapes, painted entirely outdoors around his part of Donegal at all times of day and night across the seasons. For this exhibition, however, he has opted for something quite different. Exchanging long walks and expansive coastland for paintings nearer to home and the intimate wild garden he inherited from his father, now being planted afresh by his wife as



she recovers from cancer. Each garden painting has a sea painting companion, each painting session in the garden incorporating a short walk across the road to paint the sea.

In his words 'the to-ing and fro-ing is part of the artwork. I love the feel of going between the two places - the openness of the sea, the salty plight of the trees growing naturally near the shoreline, and then the trees planted with a kind of ragged design, the plants growing within the embrace of terracotta pots'. The paintings allow for deep psychological and allegorical resonances in the landscape in all weathers. Browne also likes to work on a small scale, admitting that he loves 'the challenge of condensing as much feeling as I can into the smallest possible space'.

Cornelius Browne is a painter and writer, documenting the coastal area around Maghery in Donegal where he grew up. Following his graduation in fine art from the National College of Art & Design in Dublin, he worked at the Irish Museum of Modern Art before returning to Donegal. His paintings have been shown in solo exhibitions, Weathering and An Invite to Eternity, at the McKenna Gallery in Omagh, and All Nature has a Feeling at Regional Cultural Centre in Letterkenny, and in many group exhibitions around Ireland. Since 2016, he has tutored plein air workshops at Glebe House & Gallery in Churchill, Donegal and at the Dublin Plein Air Festival. He has worked in film as a production designer and screenwriter and has published fiction and poetry. He writes a regular column for The Visual Artists' News Sheet, published by Visual Artists Ireland and is a contributor to Sunday Miscellany on RTÉ, Radio 1. He is currently working on his first book.


HELEN COMERFORD, an artist and her legacy - curated by Catherine Marshall

Helen Comerford (1945–2024), the artist and her legacy. An exhibition presented in two parts.

The first part of this exhibition, "Helen Comerford the Artist", is a solo show of work across a range of disciplines by Helen Comerford who died very suddenly on March 24th last. Comerford's long career, lasting up to the day before her death at the age of 78, embraced sculpture, painting and installation, all of it inspired by her deep study of anthroposophy and her humanity as much



as by her total commitment to art. The show includes some of the sculptural objects she made throughout a lifetime of making, in an astonishing variety of materials from paper, clay, straw and wood to cotton, using techniques from carving and cutting to sewing and tearing, as well as the paintings in oil and encaustic for which she is best known. She was a founder member of Na Cailleacha, the collective of 8 older women artists, and during COVID 19 she was featured in a short documentary on TG4. Her work has been shown in places all over the world, including solo shows in Germany, Greece, The Netherlands, The USA and Wales and is included in the collections of the Irish Museum of Modern Art, the Hugh Lane Gallery, the University of Limerick, the Butler Gallery, and Trinity College, Dublin.

The second part of the exhibition, Helen Comerford, the Legacy, centres on her inspirational work as a teacher at Ormonde College, Kilkenny and as an important giver to her community. It fleshes out Comerford's belief that the arts are central to the health of society, which led to her involvement with sculptural symposia, the Kilkenny Arts Festival, the Wexford Arts Centre and the artists support organisation, Visual Artists Ireland. It will bring together work by former students who went on to have professional careers and who have sustained that through challenging times ever since. These will include photography, sculptures and paintings by artists such as Lorna Corrigan, Andrew Pike and the late George McCutcheon who went on to become studio artists at KCAT in Callan, which Comerford did much to shape and encourage in its formative years.

Portrait photographer and Cashel native Mark Fitzell is probably best known for his 'Many Faces of Cashel' project, where for the last decade he has been photographing and interviewing the people of Cashel. This project has to date produced over 350 photos with 5 volumes of books, an exhibition, and an appearance on RTÉ One's Nationwide.

Eoin Gleeson is an actor and theatre-maker hailing from Cashel, Tipperary. His work circuits the nuanced beauty and horror of his lovely Ireland and includes themes such as identity, generational trauma and love.

The committee of Cashel Arts Festival recognises the importance of outreach by working in partnerships with local schools and the community to actively involve them in the arts.

CASHEL: OUR PLAYGROUND

Continuing on from our successful Memoir Project in 2023, 'Cashel: Our Playground' will gather more stories of life in Cashel, with particular focus on memories of play - a subject that came up again and again in people's memories of the town.

We are delighted to work with Rebecca Lenehan again this year, whose experience giving writing workshops has encouraged and drawn out the memoir stories from local writers.

Together with actor and sound recorder Eoin Gleeson, who has captured audio recordings of almost every memoir piece, Rebecca has collected an interesting array of snapshots of life in Cashel – from playing Cowboys and Indians on the Bishop's Walk to freely running along the ramparts of The Rock.

Cashel Arts Festival is also delighted to welcome Mark Fitzell who adds a visual element to the project. Working with archive photos and the people of Cashel, he has captured a moving record of play on Cashel's streets.

With an MA in English Literature and an MPhil in Medieval Literature from Cambridge University, Rebecca Lenehan has written articles for The Independent, was the researcher for a book on Graham Greene and worked for a publishing company in Cambridge. She writes regularly for the Irish Country Living section of the Irish Farmers Journal. She also writes poetry and prose at every opportunity. Rebecca has coordinated many arts projects, including a memoir project and Artisans of Cashel for Cashel Arts Festival as well as Elders of Clonmel for Clonmel Applefest in 2023 and a follow-up book in 2024.

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
